Raised in Salem, Virginia, Charles Kipps was a basketball star (6'8" tall) and sports reporter for his high school paper. He repeated both roles at Bridgewater College in Virginia, where his interests ranged from a major in Chemistry to athletics and writing.

Upon graduation, he moved to Washington, D.C., rented an office, put a sign on the door that read "Personal Management" and took an ad in the local paper for talent. He found a group called The Presidents who wanted to work with an up-and-coming producer-writer named Van McCoy.

The group hit with an R&B - Pop crossover tune, "5-10-15-20-25-30 Years Of Love" and began a relationship between Van and Charles that led to the formation of Whitehouse Productions in 1971. Early in 1976, the company's name was changed to <u>McCoy-Kipps</u> <u>Productions</u> and their level of success has been staggering. <u>McCoy-Kipps Productions</u> is involved with the careers of David Ruffin (for whom Charles recently wrote the smash hit "Walk Away From Love"), The Stylistics, Melba Moore, Glady's Knight & The Pips, and of course, Van McCoy, himself.

Only this last month <u>McCoy-Kipps</u> has signed a production agreement with MCA to deliver two albums of new R&B oriented acts. Their first such artist will probably be actress Tamara Dobson, co-star of the film "Norman, Is That You?" Meanwhile, they are involved in a similar deal for RCA with the Choice Four and Faith, Hope and Charity.
