In 1966, after a stint in the U.S. Army Special Services Entertainment Division, Cory began his record business career as Sales Promotion and Production Director for a Chicago record distribution company. Cory spent the next four years primarily in record distribution until 1970, when he set-up the General Entertainment Corp., Media Management Co. and Soul Town Press. He also became active in the Chicago offices of NATRA (National Association of Television and Radio Announcers).

Cory's first production success came in 1973 with the Gold Record "Love Jones" by Brighter Side of Darkness on 20th Century Records. In '74, Cory moved to Florida and his new Trans America Productions, Inc. won the 1974 NATRA Emmy Award for the "most promising production company of the year." Cory re-established his General Entertainment Corp. and Media Management Co. and also organized two music publishing companies, Decibel (BMI) and King Drive (ASCAP).

By 1977, Cory Wade was recognized in both <u>Record World</u> and <u>Billboard</u> as one of the outstanding disco-R&B producers in the country for his work with T-Connection, Peter Brown and Funk Machine. This year he has received Gold records with Peter Brown for the album "Fantasy Love Affair," the single "Dance With Me," and the first Gold 12" disco record ever attained with "Do Ya Wanna Get Funky With Me." The album and single "Get Off" by the group Foxy has also gone Gold within the last few months and, for the second year in a row, Cory Wade has been recognized in the trades as one of the country's most successful disco producers.

Cory has recently been appointed to the position of A&R Director for T.K. Productions, will soon be working on Timmy Thomas (see our A&R Newsletter) and will undoubtedly be NEW ON THE CHARTS again soon.
